For All Carroll County High Schools

Commissioner Student Leadership Scholarship

\$1000 awarded to one 2009 graduating senior from each Carroll County high school and the Career & Technology Center

Applicant must have at least a 2.500 cumulative un-weighted high school grade point average, be a Carroll County resident, have made significant contributions to high school and community activities and submit a typed, one page essay answering either of the following:

If you were to devote one year of service to a volunteer project, what would it be and what would you hope to accomplish?

OR

Pick one community activity in which you participated. Describe it, what it meant to you, and how the experience has influenced you and your education.

Recipient must enroll full-time as a degree-seeking student at Carroll Community College in Fall 2009 and Spring 2010.

This scholarship does not require completion of the 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

South Carroll High School

The South Carroll Scholarship

\$500 to one 2009 graduating senior

Applicant must have at least a 3.000 cumulative un-weighted high school grade point average, be a South Carroll or Mount Airy resident and demonstrate financial need on the 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Recipient must enroll at least part-time (minimum of six billable hours) as a degree-seeking student at Carroll Community College in Fall 2009 and Spring 2010.

Westminster High School

The David S. & Cathy P. Bollinger Scholarship

\$600 to one 2009 graduating senior

Applicant must have at least a 3.000 cumulative un-weighted high school grade point average, be a Carroll County resident and demonstrate financial need on the 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Recipient must enroll full-time as a degree-seeking student at Carroll Community College in Fall 2009 and Spring 2010.

Winters Mill High School

\$600 to one 2009 graduating senior

Applicant must have at least a 3.000 cumulative un-weighted high school grade point average, be a Carroll County resident and demonstrate financial need on the 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
