- Admission Essay
- Two teacher and/or guidance counselor recommendation forms

- Scholarship Application (All students are strongly encouraged to apply.)

Application Deadlines

There are two options for applications, Early Action and Regular Admission. The benefits of applying under the Early Action option include a waived application fee, early notification of the admission decision and the peace of mind offered in knowing that your college career plans are in place.

Early Action

December 18, 2009 – Application and scholarship materials due
Mid-February 2010 – Notification of Early Action admission decisions
May 1, 2010 – Accepted applicant reply deadline

Regular Admission

February 26, 2010 – Application and scholarship materials due
Early April, 2010 – Notification of admission to applicant
May 1, 2010 – Accepted applicant reply deadline
