Basic Motorcycle Safety (BRC)

No previous motorcycle riding experience necessary. Upon successful completion, students receive a Completion Certificate for their Class M designation.

Basic Motorcycle Safety II (Alternate BRC)

This 1-day course is for riders with some experience who do not have a Class M designation. Upon successful completion, students will receive a Completion Certificate for their Class M designation.

Feeling anxious about getting started?

Jump Start

This short course is designed for beginning students who have never driven a motorcycle and would like to gain some practice with elementary riding skills before starting the official range portion of the BRC. Student to instructor ratio is lower than the BRC to allow more individual instruction. Prerequisite: Students must have successfully completed the classroom portion of the BRC. This course is not required and does not lead to a Completion Certificate for a Class M designation.

Glass Candy Houses are a unique new craft developed by Nonnie Lyketsos combining the charm of traditional gingerbread houses with the beauty of stained glass. However, unlike gingerbread, these houses are a permanent craft which will grace holiday tables for years to come. And unlike stained glass, they use no solder to keep them solidly, permanently assembled. They use caulk. They are also lit from within for a beautiful stained glass glow. If you have ever made a gingerbread house, you will be able to make a gorgeous glass candy house of your very own. Some basic supplies are included. Students need to supply an approximately 12"x12" plywood board for a base and buy their own decorative glass.
