In my role as President of Carroll Community College's Foundation Board of Directors, I am often asked by business leaders what impact their support of the College has on our community. As a senior leader at a multi-national corporation with a significant presence in Carroll County, I can proudly say that no investment has been more beneficial than our support of Carroll Community College in developing a highly skilled workforce and creating a strong community for our employees to work and thrive.

And the proof is in the numbers. In FY 2018, more than 7,000 students enrolled in Continuing Education workforce development courses. The College now offers 42 Continuing Education workforce training certificate programs, including apprenticeships and short-term certifications. More than 2,500 workers received customized training and consulting through the College's Advantage C division. Close to 300 small business operators were enrolled in courses and conferences through their MILLER: Resources for Entrepreneurs.

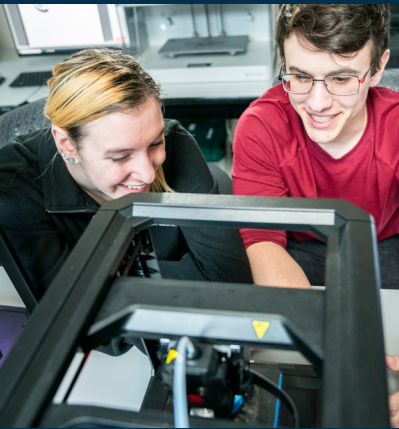
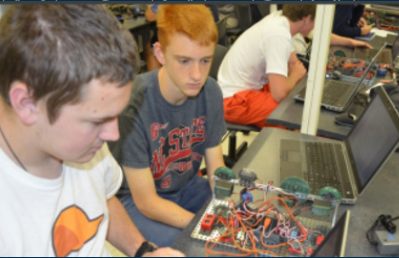

# Achievements



## Academic Scholarship Support

Carroll Community College is committed to the principal that higher education should be affordable for all students. In support of this tenet, the Foundation proudly provided scholarships to approximately 324 students in 2019, totaling \$613,125.

- The Foundation awarded \$232,318 in scholarships, which were funded by more than 100 generous individual and corporate scholarship donors.
- \$317,144 was awarded to 98 students through the Carroll Promise Scholarship program, which was established for the 2108-2019 academic year to bridge the gap until funding from the Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship program became available to eligible Maryland community college students.
- \$42,000 in Jump Start awards were given to Carroll County students who enrolled full-time at Carroll Community College after completing requirements as a dually enrolled high school student.
- \$21,663 was awarded to students participating in Continued Education and Training programs.

## High Impact Programming

- With technology advancing at an expedient rate, it is vital that today's students stay abreast of the latest advances in their fields of study. The Foundation supported this need by investing more than \$70,000 in high impact programs such as the Digital Fabrication Lab, STEM Program and Drone Pilot Program.
- The Foundation invested \$60,600 in the establishment of the new Research and Collaboration Center, a student-centric space for meetings, seminars and collaborative studying. The area is being utilized by numerous honors groups, including STEM Scholars, Hill Scholars, Phi Theta Kappa (honor society for 2-year colleges), Psi Beta (Psychology honor society), Delta Alpha Pi (honor society for students with disabilities) and Alpha Delta Nu (Nursing honor society).

## State-of-the-Art Equipment & Learning Technology

Having access to quality, state-of-the-market technology is critical to a quality education.

- In 2019, the Foundation invested more than \$160,000 in technology for the College. This included \$107,158 in hardware updates, as well as \$56,035 in software and related technological services.
- Through a Foundation investment of \$10,337, Carroll Community College's ceramics studio was furnished with a kiln, wheel, clay and paint supplies, creating an innovative space for both credit and non-credit students.



## Advancing Student Support and Community

Carroll Community College understands that the success of our students and the wellbeing of our community are intertwined. In FY 2019, the Foundation awarded \$32,211 in support of community-based initiatives.

- A school community is built on more than just classes, so the Foundation is proud to support the new College Athletic program with \$15,205 in equipment and field improvements. Go Lynx!
- \$992 was given in support of the free conflict coaching, mediation and facilitation services provided to county residents by the Carroll County Community Mediation Center.
- \$8,475 was invested in the Littlest Learners Child Development Center, including the funding of a children's reading area.

## Carroll Food Locker

It is hard to learn on an empty stomach, yet there are many in our community who struggle with food insecurity. The Carroll Food Locker Program offers grocery assistance to Carroll Community College students, faculty and staff in need, so they don't have to choose between meals and education. The Foundation provided \$2,700 in support of this mission.

## Starry Night Gala

The 13th Annual Starry Night Gala was held on Friday, December 7, 2018 to a sold-out audience. The event began in our beautifully transformed Babylon Great Hall with elegant food and drinks. The gala celebrated the music of the 1960s and the audience enjoyed an evening in our theater with the amazing sounds of Glenn Burtnik's Summer of Love Concert. Through sponsorship, ticket sales, the silent/live auction and the public launch of the Investing in a Brilliant Future Campaign, the event raised approximately \$158,000 to provide Carroll students with opportunities to pursue their passions, transform their futures and realize their dreams, as well as generating \$85,000 in additional commitment to the Investing in a Brilliant Future Campaign.

## Penguin Random House Book Fair

The 22nd Annual Penguin Random House Book Fair took place on March 1 & 2, 2019 with more than 4,500 people in attendance. This favorite community event is devoted to raising the level of awareness of literacy and education, creating a love of reading for all ages and raising much-needed funds for student scholarships. The weekend was filled with excitement and activities such as book sales, author events, the showing of *Ralph Breaks the Internet*, an improv seminar, a silent auction, STEM activities, a scavenger hunt and other family-friendly activities. The event generated approximately \$60,000 which will directly support student scholarships.
