Disclosure of Institutional Graduation Rates, Transfer-out Rates, Retention Rates

Carroll Community College is pleased to provide the following information regarding our institution's graduation/completion rate, transfer-out rate, and fall-to-fall retention rate. The information is provided in compliance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. The rates reflect the graduation, completion, and transfer-out status of students who enrolled during the 2017-18 academic year and for whom 150% of the normal time-to-completion has elapsed.

During the fall semester of 2017, 387 first-time, full-time, certificate or degree-seeking undergraduate students entered Carroll Community College. After three years (i.e., as of August 31, 2020) 39% of these students had completed a certificate or degree, and 17% had transferred to other higher education institutions prior to earning a credential from Carroll Community College.

While reviewing this information, please bear in mind:

- Graduation and transfer-out rates are based on three years of attendance that equates to 150% of our longest program which typically requires about 60 credits.
- Graduation and transfer-out rates are calculated using a cohort of students who were
 attending college for the first-time, attended full-time in their first term, and were seeking a
 degree or certificate; all other students are excluded.
- Many students in the cohort do not remain full-time students but switch to part-time attendance; some students graduate or transfer-out after three years.
- An asterisk (*) denotes any cohort/subcohort with five or fewer students. In order to protect student privacy, the college is not required to disclose this information.
- Carroll Community College did not participate in intercollegiate athletics prior to fall 2019 and did not enroll student athletes in academic year 2017-18; therefore, graduation, transfer-out, and retention rates are not available for student athletes.
