As a business leader here in Carroll County, I continue to be amazed by the number of people whose lives have been touched by Carroll Community College, as I hear their stories about how the College helped them turn their dreams into reality.

Carroll is the community's college and continues to be the first choice for both full and part-time students. 49% of the County's college-bound high school graduates attend Carroll full-time, and 69% of all Carroll County residents who enroll in college part-time attend Carroll.

The diversity of the College's programs continues to grow, with more than 45 credit degrees and concentrations, 15 credit certifications, and 30 Workforce Training Certificates that lead to licensure or certification for career entry and advancement. And more than half of Carroll's career program graduates work in jobs related to their program of study at the time of graduation, strong evidence that the dreams of our students quickly become a reality.

These favorable outcomes would not be possible without the support of our donors and partnerships within the business community. Many of our students rely on state and federal financial aid, and they also need the support of scholarships funded through your generous donations. The challenges of the past year have affected many of our students, and without your support, they could not have enrolled in or continued their studies at Carroll Community College.

Achievements

Academic Scholarship Support



The Carroll Community College Foundation is committed to providing an empowering, accessible, high-quality education to students through academic scholarship support for credit and noncredit students. This year approximately 291 credit students received scholarships totaling \$392,968. Prominent scholarships included:

36 Jump Start scholarships

for students who enrolled full-time at Carroll Community College after completing requirements as dually enrolled high school students.

Pappalardo Honors scholarships

(formerly Hill Scholars), a selective admissions cohort program designed to enhance the learning experience both outside the classroom as well as in the community through leadership and service-learning opportunities.

40 Non-credit students

seeking licensure, certification, and camp opportunities received scholarships impacting the educational and workforce development of the community we serve.

29 STEM Scholar scholarships

for high-achieving students in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics fields. This program provides internship, academic research, and a challenging capstone initiative along with mentoring opportunities.

First in My Family program scholarships

designed to support first-generation students at Carroll Community College. The program taps into the students' strengths while providing special resources to help navigate college.

Program Equipment & Learning Technology Support



Living, working, and learning in a virtual world has taken on a whole new meaning this year. The Foundation invested \$407,166 in state-of-the-market equipment, bearning technologies, technological upgrades, and infrastructure improvements to enhance student learning, business processes, cost efficiency, and the user experience. Additions to the College this year include:

 Funding to support the development of a redesigned website, along with the recently created Lynx and Carroll logos, represent another step forward in the rebranding efforts to enhance the Carroll experience for our valued community.



- Digital cameras, Dell monitors, and iPads to support teacher preparation and workforce development training for students in the Early Childhood Education Program. Additionally, this equipment was used with our littlest learners for face-to-face and online learning.
- New camcorders and digital camera equipment for the Computer Graphics program.
- Much needed technical equipment and cybersecurity upgrades, ensuring optimal communication and educational support services for faculty, staff, students, and visitors in a secure environment.

High Impact Programs and Economic Development



The Carroll Community College Foundation strives to stay at the forefront of real-world applications. The College was able to provide students with more innovative learning opportunities through technological enhancements to degree and certification programs such as:

- Theater upgrades, new equipment, updated controls,
 Digital System Processing, programming, and training
 which benefit the Entertainment Technology program.
- Simulated patient monitor, which mimics defibrillators and ventilators, for the EMS paramedic training program.
- 3D mapping software for the continued support of the Drone Pilot program.

Book Fair





The Penguin Random House Book Fair is an event devoted to advancing the cause of reading, literacy, and learning in our community. Respecting the safety of our community, the 24th Annual Book Fair was re-imagined and held virtually on April 9–10, 2021. The Book Fair was delivered via a micro-website that featured an

online book sale, an electronic event program guide, and our renowned silent auction. This year, our event featured free books and a variety of pre-recorded events, such as Penguin Random House author talks, children's storytime, children's craft demonstrations, STEM demonstrations, and a virtual scavenger hunt. We received over **3,000** unique page views and raised approximately **\$50,000** to support student scholarships.

Advancing Student Success



By supporting students in their endeavors both inside and outside the classroom, Carroll positions its students for a successful academic experience and prepares them for a diverse work environment. The Foundation provided:

- Book scholarships for dually enrolled FARM (Free and Reduced Meal) high school students.
- The newly created Student Emergency Assistance Fund to assist students in covering unforeseen emergency expenses such as technology and educational supplies, transportation, and childcare fees.
- Academic Services allowing 1,013 students to receive tutoring services at no charge to enhance their academic progress, educational transitions, and program completion.
- The Carroll Food Locker enabling 180 individuals in our community to receive food and toiletries to ensure they had access to nutritional food and necessary hygiene items.



 The newly developed Athletics program continued to see growth and development with the addition of both women's and men's Lacrosse programs, joining the College's already established Soccer, Cross Country, and Track & Field programs. The Athletics program provides additional scholarship and athletic opportunities for students.

Staff Development



For the College to provide a quality education, we must hire and retain **qualified staff**. The continued education of our safety personnel ensures a safe and secure learning and working environment for all staff and students. The Foundation provided funding for **additional training** and **equipment** for both College Safety & Security Officers and Campus Police.



Our annual silent auction and Give-to-the-Cause were conducted through a mobile app to support the Student Emergency Assistance Fund.
