Health & Emergency Contact Form

A current Health & Emergency Contact form is required for each participating child by June 1. A new form must be completed each year. Without this completed form on the first day of the program, your child will not be able to participate. Emergencies

If an emergency occurs, appropriate medical attention will be administered and the person designated on the form will be contacted immediately. A nurse will be on call during the program hours and a person authorized to administer selected medications (with all required forms) and first aid is on duty. The Kids@Carroll website carrollcc.edu/summerkids includes instructions about medication forms required for medications dispensed during the program hours.

Students need to be picked up by a designated individual within a 45-minute window of notification by the Health Room.

A Health Room (Isolation Room) is designated for campers and staff displaying COVID-like symptoms. Wearing a mask will be required in this room while campers are waiting to be picked up.
