## Spring 2025 Credit Enrollment Analysis

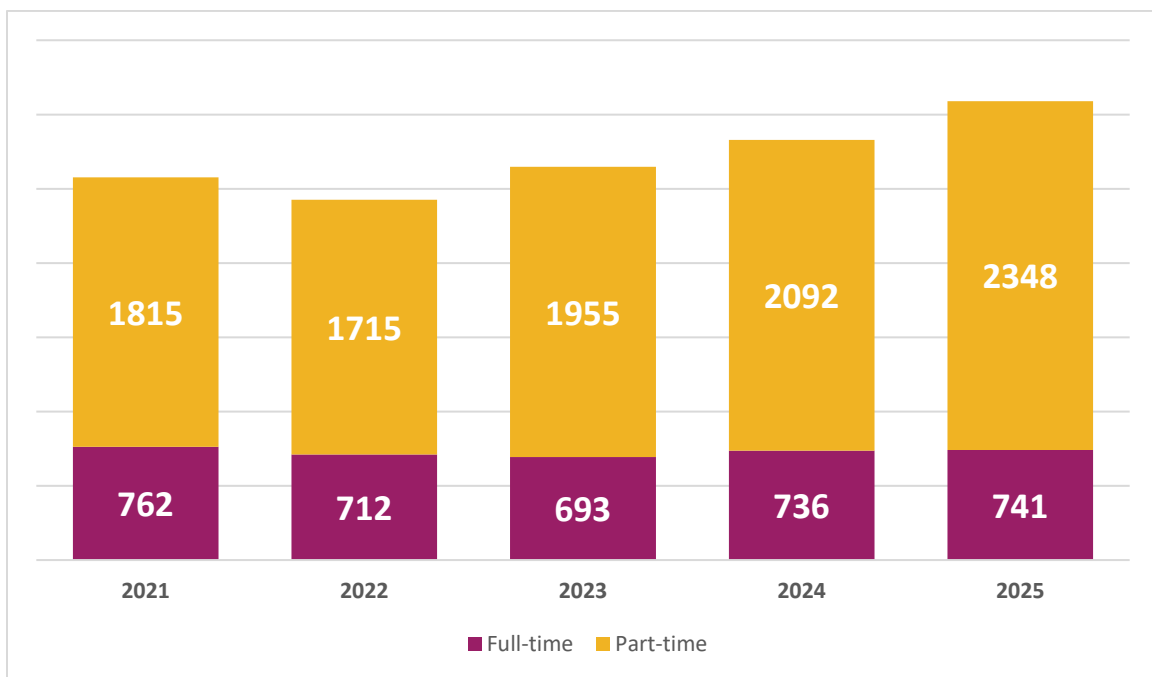

### Enrollment Highlights

- For the third consecutive year, spring enrollment, both in headcount and in full-time equivalents (FTE) has increased. Spring 2025 has a 9.2% increase in headcount and an 8.4% increase in FTE. The FTE percentage increase is the highest since Spring 2010.
- For all student groups, except dual enrollment students, the fall-to-spring retention rate is higher than last spring. This is the second consecutive year of increase for part-time students and the all-student category.
- The number of dual enrollment students increased by nearly 23% compared to last spring. Over the last five years, the number of dual enrollment students has increased by 143%.
- Enrollment in all racial/ethnic categories and all age bands have increased over last spring.

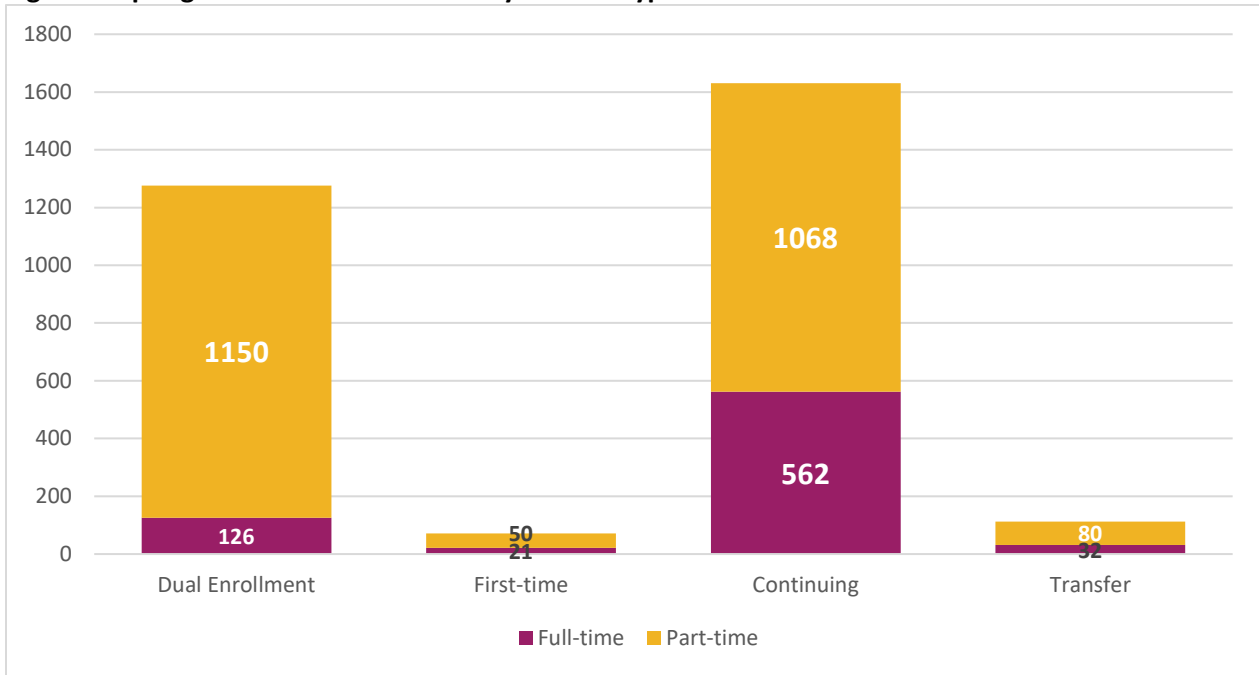
Figure 1. Spring credit enrollment by full-time/part-time status

**Figure 2. Spring 2025 credit enrollment by student type**

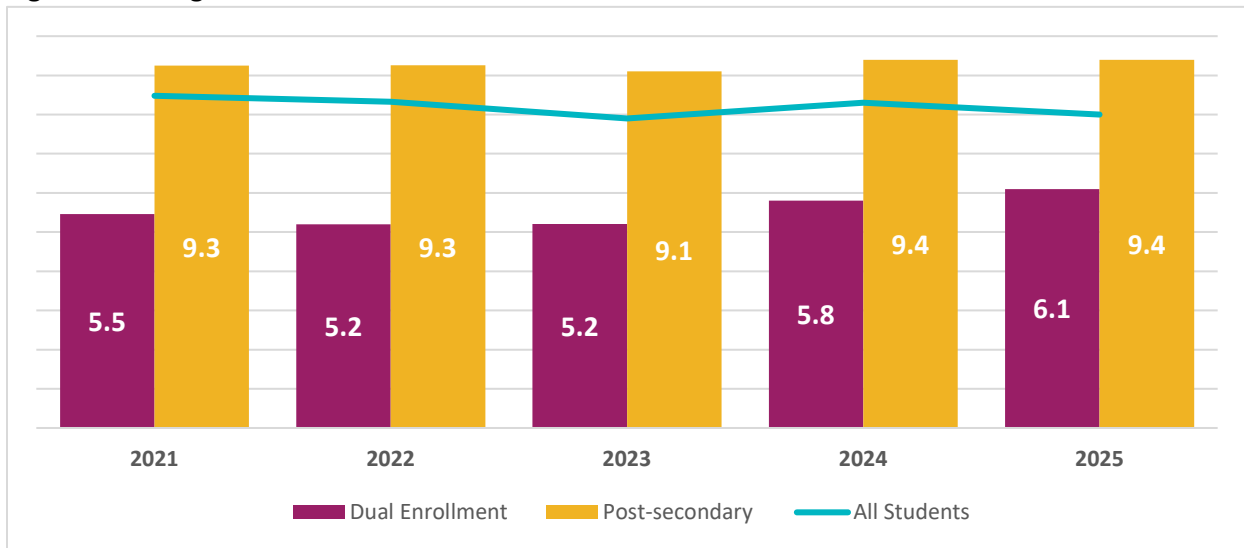

**Figure 3. Average credit hour load**

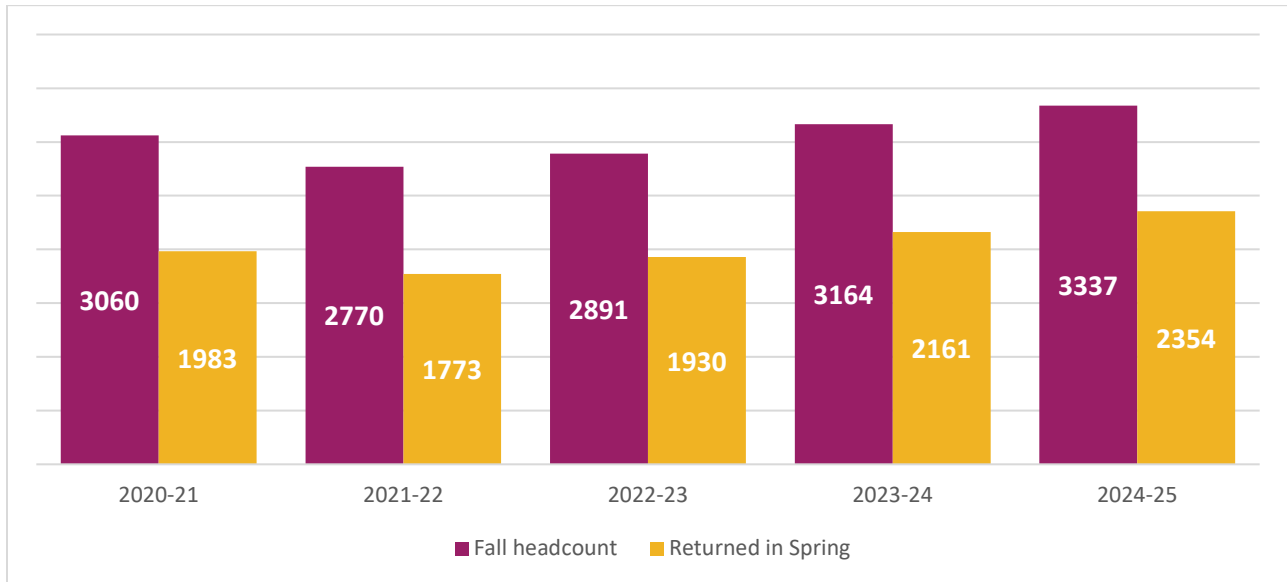

**Figure 4. Fall-to-Spring retention of all students**



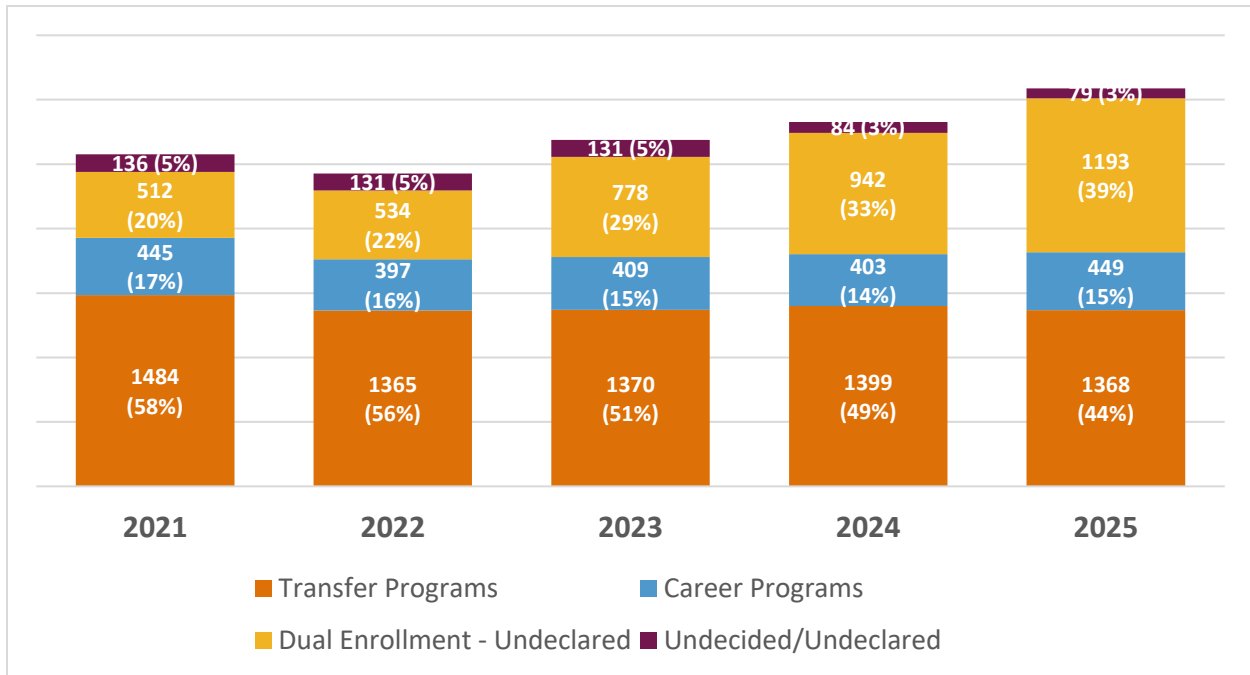

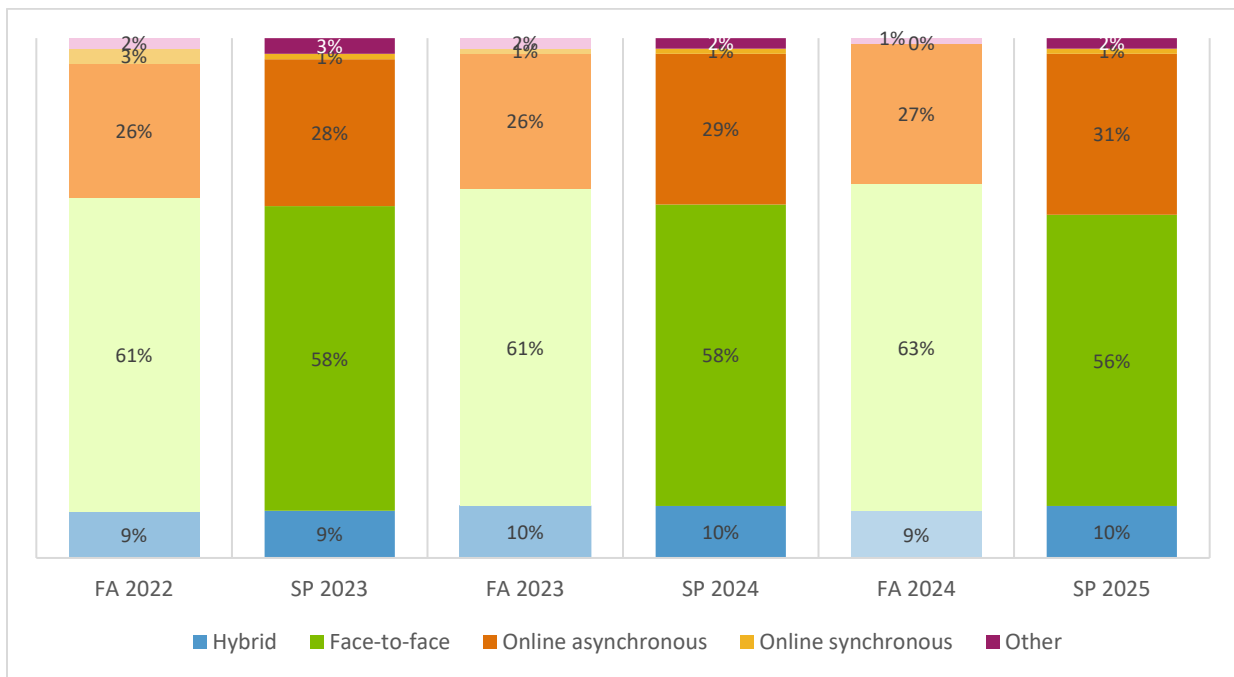
