



ATB 1.0 - FIRST YEAR START

General Information for this Blended Option*

(*begins with face to face SU course, progressing to hybrid, then to fully online)

I. General Program Information

This concurrent enrollment option is available to eligible students once they are accepted to the Carroll Community College (CCC) Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses and grade point average (GPA). Students will be enrolled as degree students at CCC and Stevenson University (SU) and begin to take SU courses during the Nursing Program at CCC. Once the Associate of Science (A. S.) Degree is awarded at CCC, students must take and pass the nursing licensure exam, the NCLEX-RN, and then continue coursework at SU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B. S.) Degree.

CCC courses will be held at the Carroll Community College campus; SU courses will be taken on the SU campus. SU nursing courses are offered initially in a face to face format and then progress to hybrid to completely online.

Two degrees will be awarded: A.S. from CCC and B.S. from Stevenson University (where a minimum of 30 credits will be required from SU to graduate with the B.S.).

Advisors will be available from both CCC and SU.

Financial aid will be arranged through Stevenson University Office of Financial Aid.

II. Program Admission Requirements

- A. Admission to CCC Nursing Program (selective process based on courses completed, GPA, and test scores)
- B. GPA of 3.0 or higher in CCC required admission courses
- C. Additional required courses with a grade of a C or better:
 - Chemistry (CHEM 101) 3-4 credits
 - Nutrition (BIOL 220) 3 credits
 - Ethics (PHIL 105) 3 credits

Note: Students can apply to SU's ATB option prior to the completion of these courses.

III. ATB Program Progression

Students must remain in CCC's nursing program and must be successful in all required courses to continue in the ATB option.

Students are expected to meet regularly with their SU advisor to review their ATB curriculum plan.

Students are expected to complete the sequence of study as outlined in the SU ATB curriculum plan.

Students must successfully pass the NCLEX-RN prior to taking the SU NATB 424 - Health in the Community course.

IV. General Application Procedures

Note: Students applying to the SU ATB Option must first be accepted to the CCC A.S. Degree Nursing Program. Admission to the SU ATB Option is contingent upon admission to CCC's Nursing Program.

All applications and transcripts must be received by the published SU application deadline.
