



## ATB 2.0 - SECOND YEAR START

*This option is for students who have successfully completed their first year of nursing at CCC.*

### **General Information for this Blended Option\***

(\*begins with hybrid courses, then moves to fully online)

#### **I. General Program Information**

This concurrent enrollment option is available to eligible students who have completed one full semester in the CCC Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses and grade point average (GPA). Students will be enrolled as degree students at CCC and Stevenson University (SU) and begin to take SU courses during the second year of the Nursing Program at CCC. Once the Associate of Science (A.S.) Degree is awarded at CCC, students must take and pass the nursing licensure exam, the NCLEX-RN, and then continue coursework at SU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Degree.

The program is designed so that students who wish can complete the Bachelor's Degree in one year after completion of the Associate Degree. Students also have the flexibility to extend the time required to complete the B.S. degree based on work and personal time constraints.

CCC courses will be held at the CCC campus. SU courses will be held at the Stevenson Owings Mills campus. SU nursing courses are offered initially in a hybrid format then progress to completely online.

Two degrees will be awarded: A.S. from CCC and B.S. in Nursing from Stevenson University (where a minimum of 30 credits will be required from SU to graduate with the B.S.).

Advisors will be available from both CCC and SU.

Financial aid will be arranged through Stevenson University Office of Financial Aid.

#### **II. Program Admission Requirements and Required Application Materials**

- Successful completion of the first year of CCC's Nursing Program
- GPA of 3.0 or higher in CCC required Year I nursing courses
- Completed application

- Final grades for CCC Nursing year one courses must be received by the deadline stated in the admission letter.

### III. Application Deadlines

All completed SU applications must be received by the published SU Application deadline.

### IV. Tuition and Fees Important Note:

CCC Nursing Students who are in the ATB Option receive a 20% discount on SU's tuition. Tuition is subject to change from one academic year to the next. ### V. ATB Program Progression

Students must remain in CCC's nursing program and must be successful in all required courses to continue in the ATB option.

Students are expected to meet regularly with their SU advisor to review their ATB curriculum plan.

Students are expected to complete the sequence of study as outlined in the SU ATB curriculum plan.

Students must successfully pass the NCLEX-RN prior to taking the SU NATB 424 - Health in the Community course.
