Refuse to Be Compromised: Integrity Council's Suggestions for Spring 2023

"One of the truest tests of integrity is its blunt refusal to be compromised." -- Chinua Achebe

It's essential to each student and instructor's integrity to understand and practice "certain standards of academic honesty and social conduct" here at Carroll (Carroll's Code of Integrity). However, many students and instructors aren't sure where to find resources that are easily accessible, clear, and specific to our Carroll community.

In this series, we will discuss the Integrity Council's Top 3 Suggestions for a great Spring 2023.

Suggestion #1: PICK THE BRAIN OF A LIBRARY STAFF MEMBER!

Our Carroll Community College library staff members are, perhaps, quieter versions of Indiana Jones in the World of the Google Search—they can help a student, instructor, or staff member discover an item that they are looking for AND teach that same student, instructor, or staff member how to discover items in the future. Go meet our librarians and take advantage of the resources offered by the library. The library staff has created resources about researching, evaluation, and citing sources, which can be found on the library's website: library.carrollcc.edu.

Turnitin Draft Coach

Turnitin Draft Coach is a program that can assist you with your research and writing by:

- Allowing you to submit your writing for a similarity score three times before you turn it in for your course without putting your paper in the Turnitin database
- Looking at your grammar and spelling
- Double-checking that all your in-text citations have matching references and vice versa

Draft Coach does not check the format of your citations and references. Draft Coach must be enabled in a browser.

Draft Coach is not fool-proof. We encourage students to use both this tool as well as the Academic Center to get your writing reviewed.

New Benefits Helpline for Carroll Students!

If you receive financial aid through the state of Maryland, a Pell grant, any emergency funding or are the first in your family to go to college, you could be eligible for benefits like grocery assistance (SNAP), discounted internet (Affordable Connectivity Plan), or health care assistance. The application process for these programs can be complex and time consuming.

Carroll Community College has partnered with the Maryland Benefits Center to provide a onecall referral line especially for our students. **Call 1-855-481-9276, Monday through Friday 9 am to 5 pm, for individual help.** The expert on the referral line can take your information and then complete the applications for multiple benefits, if applicable.
