Update Your Emergency Contact Information

Under the Lynx Student Portal, please update your emergency contact information. This information is located on the top right on the screen, found by clicking on your username.

When you select Emergency Information, you will see the emergency contact information that we have on record for you. If the information is correct, please hit the confirm button. If the information is not correct, please update the information by selecting the pencil icon and editing the information.

Emergency Contact information needs to include name, phone number, and the emergency contact checkbox selected. After inputting the correct information, select update contact to save the new emergency contact information.

Verify Your Demographic Information

Under the [Lynx Student Portal](#), please update your user profile information. This information is located on the top right of the screen, found by clicking on your username (or picture). When you select User Profile, you will see your personal information.

If the information is correct, please select the confirm button. If your current home address/cell phone number/personal email/preferred pronoun is not correct, please update the information.

If you want to withdraw or drop a class, you can use the Lynx Student Portal. Just go to the Forms tile on the bottom right (see top screenshot). Then click on Withdraw/Drop Class (see bottom screenshot).

That will START the process.

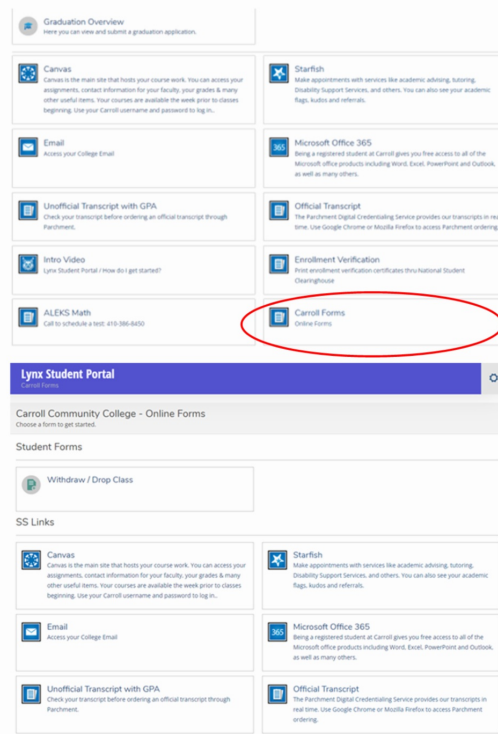
After that, look for an email to accept or deny that change once it has been received.

SELF PLAGIARISM:
Reusing portions of one's own work in other courses without an instructor's prior permission or informing each instructor if the work is being submitted for multiple courses during the same time.

WHAT CAN STUDENTS DO?
If a student is repeating a course, let the instructor know. Students cannot simply resubmit graded work a second time.
If assignments between different classes seem alike, talk with the instructors of those courses to make sure you can use the same information for both classes.

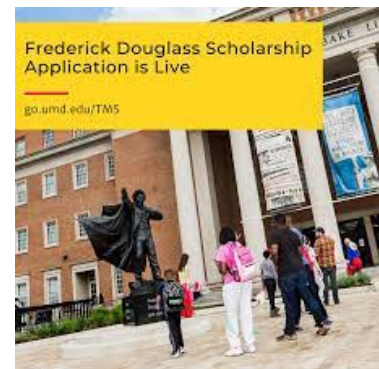
