Best Practices for Reaching Out

1. Identify the Right Person

- ✓ Check who has authority over your issue.
- ✓ Use government websites for contacts.

2. Research First

- ✓ Gather accurate facts.
- ✓ Understand past decisions and upcoming votes.
- ✓ Suggest solutions, not just complaints.

3. Be Clear & Respectful

- √ State your purpose quickly.
- ✓ Ask for specific action.
- ✓ Stay calm and polite.

4. Choose the Best Channel

√ Email = formal record.

- √ Phone = urgent/personal.
- ✓ In-person = complex issues.
- \checkmark Don't be afraid to ask for a meeting.

5. Personalize Your Message

- ✓ Use titles and last names.
- ✓ Explain why it matters to you and your community.
- ✓ Be ready to answer questions.

6. Keep It Focused

- ✓ Stick to one main issue.
- ✓ Use bullet points for clarity.
- ✓ Bring notes or a short handout.

7. Follow Up

- \checkmark If no response in 1–2 weeks, send a polite reminder.
- \checkmark Always thank them for their time or action.

8. Build Relationships

- ✓ Attend public meetings.
- ✓ Stay in touch, not just when you need something.
