I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is to establish a collaboration between McDaniel and Carroll in an effort to facilitate the transfer and degree completion of students earning the above-named degrees.

This agreement serves to develop a transfer pathway with degree requirements for the completion of both an associate's degree and bachelor's degree. The agreement also seeks to ensure the maximum potential for student success.

This Agreement also serves as a Memorandum of Understanding between both institutions for the purpose of clarifying roles and responsibilities in this partnership.

II. TERMS

Under this agreement CCC students who have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher and have completed the requirements for an associate of arts – arts and sciences exercise science will:

1. Receive guaranteed admission to McDaniel.
2. Be considered for transfer scholarships if they are eligible.
3. Be able to register for classes in April to ensure they will be able to enroll in the classes necessary to complete their degree in a timely manner.
4. Have access to a Kinesiology advisor at McDaniel to ensure smooth transfer.
5. Be eligible for additional scholarship consideration if they are members of Phi Theta Kappa (PTK).

In order to take advantage of this agreement CCC students will apply no later than January 15th and submit the deposit by March 15th.

III. ONGOING COLLABORATION

1. In the spirit of articulation, faculty representatives from both institutions will meet regularly to engage in ongoing discussion to enhance and strengthen this collaboration.

2. In an effort to strengthen this partnership McDaniel's kinesiology department agrees to have faculty serve as a resource, as available, to Carroll students and faculty as guest lecturers, workshop/seminar facilitators and other program exchanges.
3. In an effort to strengthen this partnership Carroll agrees to learn about McDaniel's kinesiology to highlight opportunities at McDaniel to students, as well as to have faculty serve as a resource, as available, to Carroll students and faculty as guest lecturers, workshop/seminar facilitators and other program exchanges.
4. In an effort to strengthen this partnership both institutions agree to communicate program changes in a timely manner to avoid disruption to student progress toward degree completion.

IV. PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

The following details a recommended course of study for students earning the Associate of Arts degree in Arts and Sciences with an Exercise Science concentration at Carroll Community College transferring to McDaniel in pursuit of the Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in Kinesiology. Where noted, course equivalencies, general education (*) and major (#) applicability are indicated. In the spirit of the College Readiness and Completion Act of 2013, this agreement encourages the completion of all associate degree requirements and details the transferrable credits toward a bachelor's degree.

Note: All students interested in this program must complete the McDaniel College application process and be admitted to the college before credit evaluations are completed at McDaniel. Only courses where the student has earned a grade of "C-" or higher will be considered for transfer. The above plan results in 63 earned credits, which is considered sophomore class level at McDaniel (32-63.5 credits). Students may wish to complete one additional credit at CCC to enter McDaniel at the junior class level (64-95.5 credits). Students may also wish to achieve proficiency in a second language, as this is a requirement at McDaniel. Students can transfer a maximum of 64 credits.

Upon completion of an Associate of Arts degree, students will automatically receive a waiver to the McDaniel Plan requirements of First Year Seminar and one QR. Contact the admissions office to learn about scholarship and need-based financial aid opportunities that may be available to you.
