Articulation Agreement Carroll Community College Hill Scholars Program and Washington College

INTRODUCTION

This document establishes a formal articulation agreement between Carroll Community College's Hill Scholars Program and Washington College. It is based upon a thorough review and analysis of the Hill Scholars curriculum at Carroll Community College as it applies to the requirements for a baccalaureate degree. This agreement will facilitate the admission of Hill Scholars and the transferability of their academic credits from Carroll Community College to Washington College's bachelor's degree programs.

ACADEMIC AGREEMENTS

- Each program at Washington College shall be permitted to stipulate specific transfer matriculation and course / grade requirements for Hill Scholar transfer students, provided that such stipulations are consistent with the general articulation or transfer policies of the institution.
- All credits earned in the Hill Scholars general education curriculum will transfer to Washington College. Courses completed outside general education will be articulated based on the academic major.
- Upon transfer to Washington College, Hill Scholars with an Associate of Arts degree will be admitted as junior students.
- Hill Scholars will have access to Washington College academic advising through Carroll Community College's Director of Transfer and Retention.
- Transfer students must be in good academic standing in Carroll Community College's Hill Scholars Program with a 3.0 minimum cumulative grade point average.
- In those cases where a Hill Scholar does not meet the minimum academic qualifications, credit hour requirements, or specific program requirements for admissions as specified above, the receiving institution will retain the authority to

consider additional academic and other credentials of its choosing to determine eligibility for admission.

SCHOLARSHIPS and FINANCIAL AID

- Students transferring from Carroll Community College to Washington College as full time students are eligible for academic scholarships on a competitive basis. Transfer students will be considered for other grants, loans, or work study awards with their native peers.
- Carroll Community College graduates who are Phi Theta Kappa members in good standing are eligible for a Washington College Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship.
- Financial award notification will be made prior to a student's commitment to attend Washington College.
- The Washington College application fee is waived for Hill Scholars program graduates.

STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM

 Qualified Hill Scholars with a minimum G.P.A. of 3.0 will be eligible upon acceptance at Washington College to participate in the Summer Study Abroad Program between their sophomore and junior years on a space available, feepaying basis. This agreement becomes effective upon signature by all parties and shall continue in effect unless voided by either party upon sixty (60) days prior written notice. Carroll Community College and Washington College will consider, in good faith, any amendments proposed by either party; however, the agreement may only be amended in writing, signed by both parties.
