

This agreement is effective with new school admits beginning in spring 2018.

This agreement will be reviewed biennially.

1. The pathway is designed for graduates of the A.A., A.S., or A.A.T. degrees at CCC. A maximum of 62 credit hours from CCC will be allowed towards fulfillment of the 124 credit hours required for baccalaureate completion at Hood.
2. Hood will determine the applicability of course work taken at other postsecondary institutions.
3. Hood will promote the completion of the associate degree by encouraging students to earn their associate prior to transfer. Students who transfer prior to earning their associate degree will be encouraged to complete their associate through a reverse transfer program.
4. This agreement is for the purposes of transfer credit only, and does not address nor guarantee any expectations of institutional or degree admission requirements, financial aid and scholarship eligibility unless otherwise noted.
5. Hood will establish a mechanism to provide information on the academic progress of the CCC student enrolled as a result of this agreement.
6. This agreement becomes effective on the date set forth on the first page of this document. One semester, or six months' notice, must be provided in writing should either party wish to terminate the agreement.
7. The agreement will be reviewed every two years.
8. CCC and Hood will abide by all State of Maryland and Federal Regulations and Laws, including FERPA policies and practices.
9. The office of record for institutional partnership agreements at Hood is the Office of the President. The office of record for agreements at CCC is the Office of Academic and Student Affairs and Dean of the Faculty's Office.
